

The Glory of Sport - Dr. Paul Gaffney January 26, 2025, 11:30 a.m.

Join the Academy in the Edna Anderson Chapel for a conversation about the (potential) greatness of sport as an expression of the human spirit. The word "glory" suggests something meaningful, deeply human, and maybe even sacred. Of course, there are plenty of problems in contemporary sport, but to understand those problems we need first to appreciate what is being corrupted, and why that is a shame.

Paul Gaffney is an Associate Professor of Philosophy in the College of Liberals Arts and Sciences at St. John's University, NY, where he has taught for the last 35 years, serving as department chair from 2007-2019. He is currently Director of St. John's University's Philosophy, Politics, and Economics (PPE) graduate program. Since 1999 he has been a summer Adjunct Associate Professor at John Cabot University in Rome, Italy, specializing in Business Ethics and the Philosophy of Art. Since 2015 he has served as the Editor of the *Journal of the Philosophy of Sport*, the official outlet of the International Association of the Philosophy of Sport. His personal engagement in sport has included playing Division I basketball at Niagara University.
