#### THIS WEEK - ACADEMY



The Galileo Affair Dr. Paul Gaffney, Edna Anderson Chapel, Today, at 11:30 a.m.

On June 22, 1633, Galileo Galilei (1564-1642) was convicted by the Inquisition of "vehement suspicion of heresy," a crime intermittent between the charges of "formal heresy" and "mild

suspicion of heresy." The Roman Catholic Church believed that his heliocentric worldview, derived from Polish astronomer Nicholas Copernicus, contradicted Holy Scripture (especially Joshua 10-13) and thereby threatened the authority of the Church. Under threat of torture, Galileo was forced to recant his scientific position and was sentenced to live out his days under house arrest in Florence. The "Galileo Affair" is one of the most fascinating, shameful, and consequential episodes in history. But it is not merely a historical episode; it raises questions that continue to challenge us today: What is the relationship between science and religion? What is the rightful authority of Scripture? What is the place of human beings in God's Divine plan and creation?

Paul Gaffney is an Associate Professor of Philosophy in the College of Liberals Arts and Sciences at St. John's University, NY, where he has taught for the last 35 years, serving as department chair from 2007-2019. He is currently Director of St. John's University's Philosophy, Politics, and Economics (PPE) graduate program. Since 1999 he has been a summer Adjunct Associate Professor at John Cabot University in Rome, Italy, specializing in Business Ethics and the Philosophy of Art. Since 2015 he has served as the Editor of the *Journal of the Philosophy of Sport*, the official outlet of the International Association of the Philosophy of Sport. Professor Gaffney has made eighteen previous presentations, on various topics, to the FPCG Academy.




# KIDS IN CRISIS - FPC YOUTH SOCIAL
